

## **PYP Student-Led Conferences**

PYP students will soon be showcasing their learning at the Student-Led Conferences. These are an opportunity for students to reflect on this year's units of inquiry, revisiting learning experiences across the curriculum, celebrating and sharing their growth and progress since August. The student-led conferences are scheduled for Wednesday 28th of May and there are several details that families should be aware of as follows:

- 1. A parent/guardian is expected to support their child by attending this event if possible. It is not an optional parent-teacher conference.
- 2. Wednesday 28th of May is not a normal school day. Students and their families will only attend school at their appointed time.
- 3. Timings and groupings will be as follows:
  - a. Running time of the event = 08:40-11:40
  - b. Meeting duration = 20 minutes
  - c. Time between meetings = 20 minutes
  - d. Number of families per time slot = 4
  - 4. 20 minutes is the minimum allotted time for conferences, but there will be a 20-minute grace period between slots, allowing students to overrun 10 minutes should they wish to.
  - 5. Homeroom teachers will be sharing the student-led conference booking form with families soon. This form will allow a maximum of four families to book the same time slot.

We look forward to welcoming you to this event where the students take full ownership of what learning they share, and how they choose to share it with you. Should you have any questions or queries, please reach out to your respective homeroom teachers.

To help streamline communication, please use Toddle to report your child's absences, including sick days or medical appointments (e.g., dentist visits).

- ◆ Daily Absence Reporting: Remember to log your child's absence in Toddle for each day they are away (e.g., Day 2, Day 3, etc.).
- ◆ Planned Absences & Holidays: Requests for leave due to holidays or other planned absences must still be submitted using the Application for Leave form. Absences submitted through Toddle or email cannot be approved for this purpose.
